| 6  | Anti-social behaviour. (Kate Richards PCSO)<br><u>Kids on bikes</u> This issue needs to be dealt with by education &<br>having regular contact with the kids. Kate is finding that the kids<br>are polite and approachable and part of the issue is aggressive<br>attitudes from some older residents. Things are thrown at the<br>kids. She is not trying to stop kids being kids, but they need to<br>stop putting themselves at risk and to be more considerate<br>towards others. Bike marking sessions at the Youth Café<br>(Highbury Hall) have been very successful and these will<br>continue. Advice is given over visibility and safety as well as<br>theft avoidance. TTC may be asked to contribute to the safety<br>measures used (normally well under £100 per session, contact<br>Dan Smith – youth engagement officer). There is still a shortage<br>of open spaces for the kids to use in the town and this will be<br>assisted greatly when the skate park goes ahead as part of the<br>Recreation Ground re-ordering. The residents' focus group<br>concerned with this was very much supportive of the skate park.<br>Cycle safety is now only taught in primary school. Jo Vos<br>reported that the Youth Café was experiencing a big new intake<br>and more kids will therefore be reached by the safety message.<br><u>Other Youth Issues</u> Cllr Bradford said more signposting to youth<br>facilities was needed. TTC will be appointing a youth officer in<br>May 2019 (new council term) to address many of these issues. A<br>recent police clinic at Homewood was well attended by parents.<br>Kate Richards said that anti-social behaviour and vandalism has<br>reduced significantly since the summer. Cllr Isworth enquired<br>about the "only 2 youths" notice in St Michaels Post Office. Kate<br>advised that this was common to many shops. |        |

| 8  | <ul> <li>General Update from Police. (From Insp Jason Atkinson)<br/>Burglary – there was a pocket of burglaries in recent months for<br/>which 2 people have been arrested. The perpetrators had been<br/>professional criminals operating over a wide area. The crime<br/>rate in the area remains very low. It would be worthwhile for the<br/>crime figures from the police web site to be used to conduct a<br/>comparison with similar sized towns in the county.<br/>The perpetrator of the recent highly-publicised burglary in<br/>Tenterden has not been identified from the CCTV despite<br/>widespread publicity. PCSOs call on the victims of burglary.<br/>There has been a spate of damage to tyres in the area – again<br/>good quality CCTV footage exists but the perpetrator has not<br/>been identified.<br/>New doorbell technology where a video of the caller is<br/>transferred to a mobile 'phone has helped apprehend offenders.<br/><u>Pubs</u><br/>No swabbing has been carried out recently. Publicans are<br/>keeping in touch with each other and helping to head off trouble.<br/><u>General Advice to public</u></li> <li>Pay attention to house lighting, purchase an alarm system<br/>or at loast a dummy hoy.</li> </ul> |  |

| 10 | <b>CCTV Update.</b> Installation had been delayed in Tenterden in<br>order to add a couple of useful extra features. The software and<br>camera units would be able to accommodate facial recognition<br>and ANPR (automatic number plate recognition). These features<br>would be enabled and introduced later. There will be a facility at<br>the monitoring centre to stream video direct to police officers<br>and PCSOs for enforcement. The installation will happen in<br>Tenterden by the end of the financial year at the latest. The<br>clerk would check with Gareth Recht at ABC whether it would be<br>cost-effective to have all our CCTV patched through to the<br>monitoring centre.  |  |
| 11 | <b>AOB.</b><br>Cllr Isworth suggested that we should invite the KE to print a positive article about achievement in the town including the CCTV and community chest grants to local organisations.<br><u>Xmas Market Weekend</u> Cllr Isworth praised the performance of the PCSOs at the event which was a great success. There were concerns over the crowd spilling into the road at the switch-on. This would be addressed by a re-scheduling of the events so that the road closure covered the parade and the switch-on, and the service at St Mildred's would follow, allowing the congregation to disperse safely afterwards.   |  |
