'Director' includes a member of the committee or management of an industrial and provident society. 'Securities' means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society.

SECURITIES. DECLARATIONS. It is a criminal offence to fail to notify the monitoring officer of any disclosable pecuniary interests (DPIs). This requirement arises in each of the following circumstances:

- (a) Before the end of 28 days beginning with the day on which you become a member or co-opted member of the authority (s30(1) Localism Act 2011));
- (b) Where the DPI is not entered in the authority's register and is not the subject of a pending notification, but is disclosed at a meeting of the authority (or any committee, sub-committee, joint committee or joint sub-committee) as required by s31(2) of the Localism Act, before the end of 28 days beginning with the date of disclosure at the meeting (s31(3) Localism Act 2011));

It is also a criminal offence to knowingly provide information that is false or misleading (or being reckless as to whether the information is true and not misleading). In addition to the above, the Town Council has adopted a code of conduct for Members which requires you to notify the Monitoring Officer of any DPIs before the end of 28 days beginning with the day on which the code takes effect. In the interests of transparency, it would also require declaration of DPIs at meetings even where they have been registered. Failure to comply with these requirements would not be a criminal offence but would be a breach of the code of conduct.
